Program Meeting: Powered parachutes by Bob Shea.

Bob Shea presented a review of **Powered parachutes** with a video created at The Tracy PPC rally. He described flying at 28 to 32 mph on a wing that is 30' wide by 10' deep and only a 4 to 1 glide ratio. The controls include foot pedals for turning and when pushed simultaneously forward create a flap like flare. The upper limits are a 12 mph wind that will prohibit the wing from collapsing after landing.
